Amount: Between £300 and £10,000

Amount: Varies from programme to programme.

Type of work supported: Various but grants managed include Grass Roots Grants, The Donarbon Community Fund, East Cambridgeshire Community Fund and Cambridgeshire County Council Small Grants.

Amount: Varies

Type of work supported: Mostly capital funding for projects dealing with Heritage and Conservation; Criminal Justice; Hospices; Older People; Youth at risk.

Amount: Small grants scheme for grants up to £5,000 only to charities with an annual turnover of less than £250,000. Other programmes may give grants of £10,000 to £25,000 as a one-off grant.

Type of work supported: Community projects run by parish churches, deaneries, dioceses and other bodies connected to or working in partnership with the Church of England. Projects must seek to take the church out into the community, bring the community into the church and strengthen the relationship between the two.

Amount: Up to £15,000

Type of work supported: Small grants for disadvantaged communities.

Amount: Up to £5,000

Type of work supported: Improving education (nurseries or youth centres) protecting heritage or environmental projects or promoting racial harmony.

Amount: £100 - £5,000

Amount: No maximum

Buildings, monuments and museums can be supported provided there is associated work or activity which helps to increase access and/or learning of the heritage to the public.

Amount: There are three programmes:

- Heritage Grants (grants of more than £50,000)

- Your Heritage (grants of between £3,000 and £50,000)
- Young Roots (grants of between £3,000 and £25,000 for young people celebrating heritage)

Amount: £100 to £10,000

- Enhancing Communities: for community improvement projects within ten miles of an active landfill site owned by SITA UK.
- Enriching Nature Programme: for wildlife projects within ten miles of any landfill site in England.
- GreenPrints: a two year joint funded youth volunteering programme encouraging 16 to 25 year olds to improve and increase the green spaces where they live.

Amount: Varies from programme to programme.
